Founder and president of MTFA Architecture, Michael Foster is an architect and urban planner. His work addresses not only his client's programmatic, financial and mission requirements, but also the formative influences of the environment, the community, the marketplace, and on our culture.

Over the past 25 years, Michael has received local and international design recognition for commercial, institutional, government, and urban design projects.
