This year, Leadership Arlington will present an Ethics Award, Community Impact Award and Nonprofit Award. Award Recipients are as follows:

Recipients are selected for their demonstration of leadership in our community and support of Leadership Arlington's mission "to enlighten, inspire and connect" leaders in our community. The recipients also exemplify ethical leadership capacities, visionary thinking, servant leadership and ethics in thoughts, words, and actions.

Randy Anderson, Regional President of United Bank, graduate of the Leadership Arlington Signature Program Class of 2002 and member of the Leadership Arlington Board of Regents, is known in the community as having a strong sense of integrity. He worked for Virginia Commerce Bank prior to its merger with United Bank. Even as the banks were merging, Randy remained an anchor of faith and was steadfast in his ethics.

A-SPAN is in its 23rd year of service to Arlington. Beginning as a simple street meal program in 1991, A-SPAN has grown into a full service organization for homeless adults that provides food, clothing, shelter, medical services, case management and housing to many of Arlington's most vulnerable residents. Within the next year, A-SPAN will be operating a year-round Homeless Services Center, which will combine all of its services in one building, including the shelter, a medical respite program and services aimed at ending homelessness in Arlington.

"We are honored to be recognized as a leader in this caring community," shared Kathleen Sibert, Executive Director of A-SPAN and Leadership Arlington Signature Program Class of 2010 graduate.
