About Teague: Teague was born in the South and grew up all over the world, always coming back to the family farm for the summers. His granddad sang the great American Songbook as he cultivated his garden or tinkered in his barn, introducing Teague to the songs he would eventually embody. He began playing the piano and writing songs at the age of 12 with musical influences ranging from Frank Sinatra and Dean Martin to Willie Nelson, Paul Simon, Elton John and the Eagles. He credits Frank Sinatra, Harry Connick, Jr. and his granddad as his greatest influences. Judge Matt Shank, President of Marymount University, commented on Teague's "velvet jacket and velvet sounds," perfectly describing the tempo of the performance.
